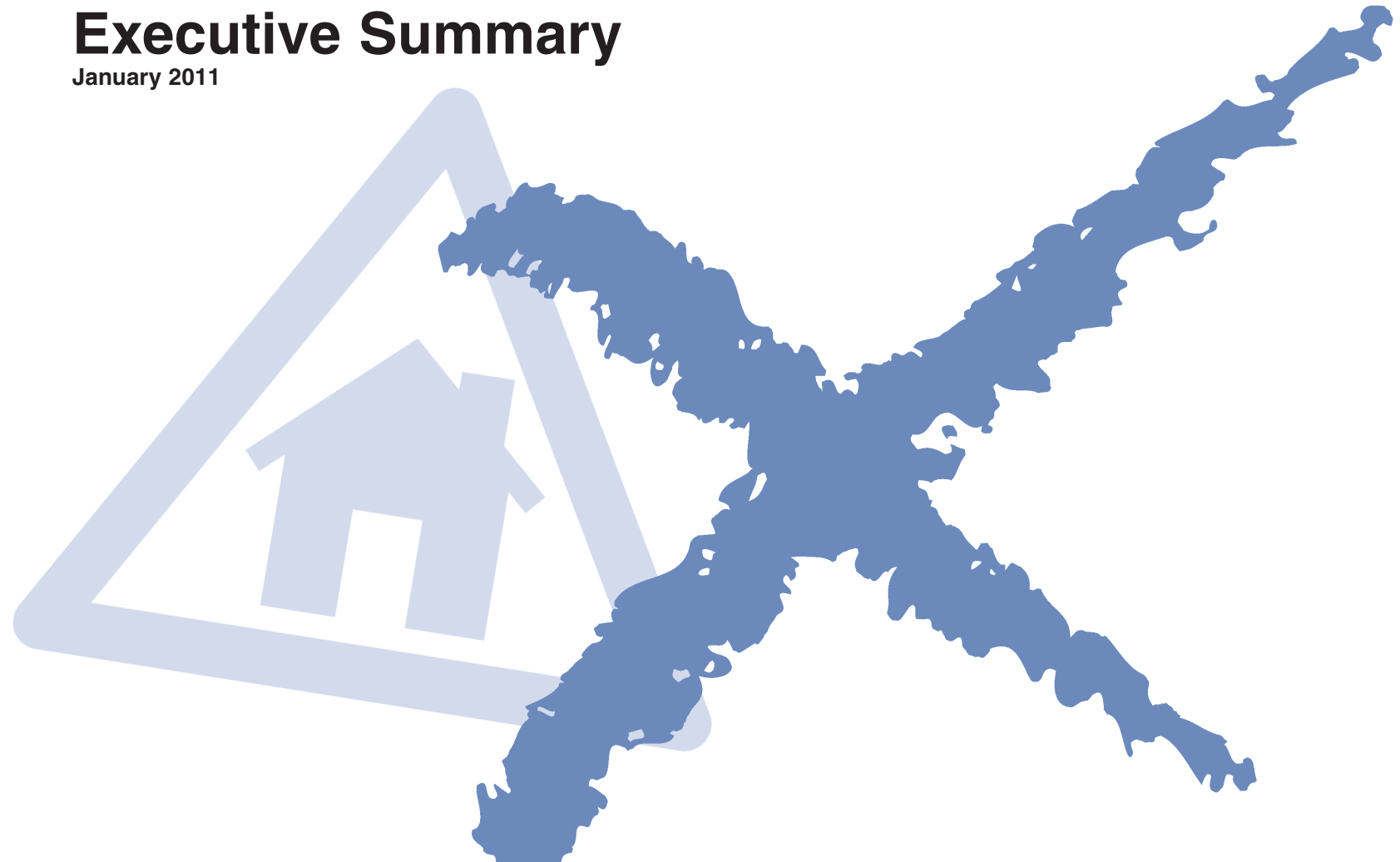


# adva training data 2009-2010

# Introduction

**Adva** (Against Domestic Violence and Abuse) is delighted to present this Executive Summary (produced by Janice Healey, adva Project Support Officer and Susannah Hunter, adva co-ordinator) of our detailed data report about the delegates adva trained during 2009–2010. The report highlights which sector and which agency our delegates came from and also in which geographical location across Devon they worked. To put some context to the 2009–2010 training data, please see the data summary table below showing top line data about the number of delegates trained by adva, per training course type, during 2007–08, 2008–09 and 2009–10:

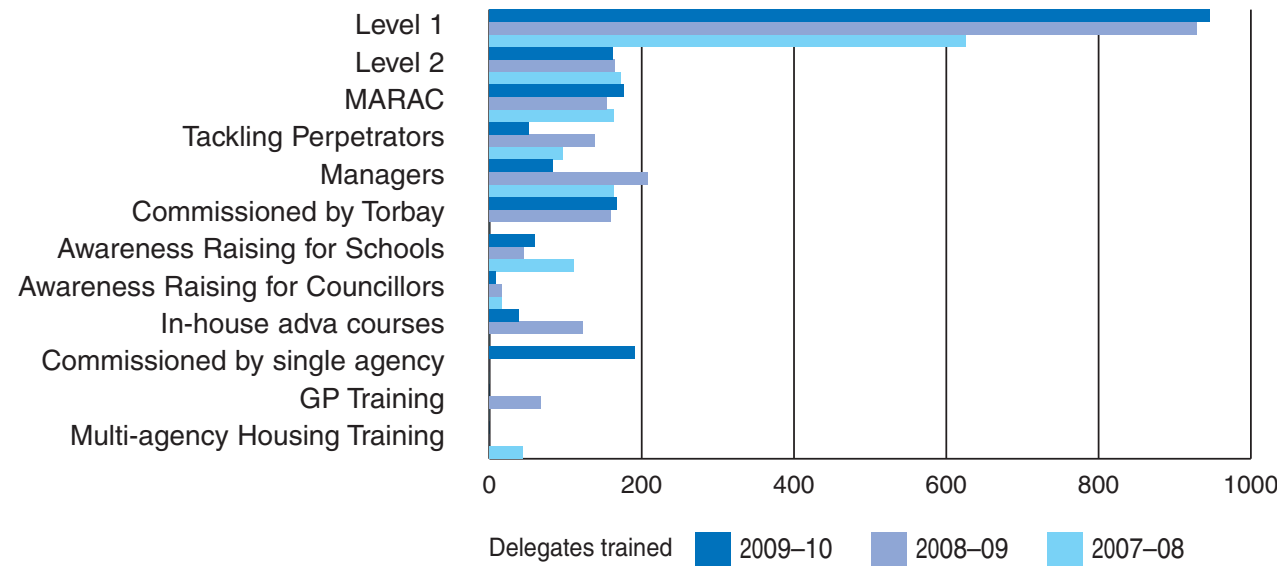

What this data tells us immediately is that 2008–2009 saw 611 more delegates through the adva training room doors than in the previous year (2007–2008). There were also 121 more delegates in 2008–2009 than there were in the following year (2009–2010).

**Examples of other quick headline data from this table include:**

- The year 2009–2010 saw a big new demand in agencies wanting to commission adva training ‘in-house’ for their employees.
- The Level 1: ‘Tackling Domestic Violence & Abuse’ foundation course continues to grow year on year in popularity and demand.
- The Level 2: OCN (Open College Network) accredited two-day ‘Domestic Violence & Abuse – The Impact on Children’ course seems to have remained at a healthy plateau over the past three years, as has our multi-agency Domestic Violence and Abuse risk assessment training (‘The MARAC Process in Devon’ new half-day course replacing the one day ‘Preventing Murder and Serious Harm’ course).
- The demand for our ‘Tackling Perpetrators of Domestic Violence & Abuse’ training course dropped considerably in 2009–2010.

This adva training data is important for monitoring trends, planning our annual training programme and responding to demand / lack of demand – as well as looking at which agencies are engaging (or not) with which training courses. What the data doesn't tell you is that the 2009–2010 training year was a year of consolidation, quality assurance review and course updating where required. We are, therefore, not surprised that we didn't exceed the delegate numbers of the year before, where implementation of the Devon County Council Employer Policy and corresponding 'Managers Tackling Domestic Violence and Abuse' training was at a peak. Also, in response to the drop in demand for our 'Tackling Perpetrators of Domestic Violence & Abuse' training course in 2009–2010, we have reviewed and revamped this course and it is now re-branded: 'Tackling Abusive Behaviour – Taking Responsibility'. Delegate evaluations for 2009–2010 also showed that adva training continues to be of high quality and very well received.

\*NB Geographical location = location of delegate's work base, not location of adva training venue. The area does not necessarily equate to the area that the Service covers, i.e. some Services, especially in Exeter are based in the city but cover a much wider area.
