



## **DEFINITIVE MAP REVIEW OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY BARNSTAPLE**

The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 requires the County Council to keep the Definitive Map of public rights of way under continuous review and to make modifications where it appears that routes should be added, regraded, amended or deleted. A review is currently being undertaken in Barnstaple.

### **Routes 6, 7, 8 & 9: Unrecorded routes – Rock Park**

Between Footpath No. 33, Footpath No. 5, the cycle path and Bridleway No. 14 on Ladies' Mile
