Devon County Council (Traffic Regulation & On-Street Parking Places) Order 2010

Devon County Council make the following order in exercise of powers under sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53, part IV of schedule 9 and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with part III of schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers

PART A - INTERPRETATION

1 In this order

Any reference to an enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended or any successive enactment

Any reference to an article, part or schedule refers to the corresponding article, part or schedule in this order unless stated and except where the context otherwise requires a reference to a numbered or lettered paragraph or sub-paragraph, is a reference to the paragraph or sub-paragraph bearing that number or letter in the article or schedule, or (in the case of a sub-paragraph) paragraph in which the reference occurs. Schedules are divided into parts and for the avoidance of doubt a schedule number is followed by the part number - for example 'schedule 1.01' means schedule 1 part 1

Where a linear restriction applies to a length of carriageway not being a clearway the effects of the restriction shall have the effect that the carriageway and footway shall be restricted from the centre line to the rear of the appropriate footway, verge or grass verge including the entrance to any side road

Except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions have these meanings assigned to them

1984 Act means Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

2002 Regulations means The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002

appropriate remittance in relation to parking permits is the sum referred to in appendix B

buses has the same meaning as in regulation 22(2) of the 2002 Regulations and **bus** shall be construed accordingly

car club means a formally constituted car-sharing scheme approved in writing by the Council to operate within its boundaries and which supports the planning and sustainable transport policy objectives of the Council. A car club must serve the immediate neighbourhood and be available to all eligible members of the local community

car club vehicle means the type of vehicle approved by the Council and provided by a car club or the Council for the use of persons who have paid any relevant membership or other car club fee and by means of a real-time or advance booking system may have use of the vehicle for a specified period and which displays the relevant identification issued and/or approved by the Council

carriageway means the way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have the right of way for the passage of vehicles

civil enforcement officer means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place or regulation in this order

community bus means a vehicle operating as a community bus under sections 19 and 22 of the Transport Act 1985

the Council means Devon County Council as highway authority

disabled person and **disabled person's badge** have the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000

delivering and **collecting** in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection

disabled person's vehicle means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge and is a vehicle which immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 to be included in an order under the 1984 Act has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or has been or is to be used for carrying disabled person's as passengers

doctor means a fully registered person as in section 55 of the Medical Act 1983

driver in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place

goods includes postal packets of any description and the collection and delivery in relation to any goods including the checking of the goods for the purpose of delivery and collection

goods vehicle means a mechanically propelled vehicle (other than a motor bicycle or tricycle not over 450kg unladen) which is constructed or permanently adapted for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden of any description which exceeds 3,500kg revenue weight

hackney carriage has the same meaning as in the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 and The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976

initial charge means the payment referred to in article 21

issuing authority means the Council or an agent acting on behalf of the Council

junction means the meeting point of the respective kerb lines of the roads referred to and where appropriate measurements shall be taken from the point of intersection of the respective kerb lines as projected

lay-by means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 1010 in schedule 6 to the 2002 Regulations and partly by a footway, verge or outer edge of the carriageway

licensed taxi has the same meaning as in section 13(3) (a) of the Transport Act 1985

main carriageway means any carriageway used primarily by through traffic and includes any carriageway of a slip road but excludes any lay-by

motorcycle means a mechanically propelled vehicle (not being an invalid carriage) with fewer than 4 wheels of which the weight un-laden does not exceed 410 kilograms

motorhome means a motor vehicle constructed or permanently adapted for use on the highway as a mobile place of accommodation on a temporary or permanent basis

owner in relation to a vehicle failing to comply with the regulations in this order shall be that person or organisation to whom the vehicle is registered with the DVLA

parking permit refers to a permit issued by or on behalf of issuing authority under the terms and conditions of parts G and H

parking place is that part of the carriageway where vehicles or vehicles of any class may wait as set out in section 32(4)(b) of the 1984 Act

parking space means a space individually marked for the leaving of a vehicle within a parking place

passenger vehicle means a motor vehicle other than a motorcycle or invalid carriage constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry no more than seventeen passengers exclusive of the driver and not drawing a trailer

penalty charge and **penalty charge notice** have the same meaning as in regulations 2(1) and 8(1) of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007

permanent user means that person who not being the legal owner of a vehicle is the normal driver and has responsibility for that vehicle

permit holder means a person who has been issued a permit under the provisions in parts G and H

public service vehicle has the same meaning as in the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981

relevant position means

- a) In the case of a disabled person's badge the position described in regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' Traffic orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000
- b) In the case of a parking disc a vehicle displays the disc in the relevant position if
 - i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or a fascia panel the disc is exhibited so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
 - ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle
- c) In the case of pay and display the ticket referred to in part F it shall be exhibited on the vehicle so that the time shown on the front of the ticket is clearly visible on the vehicle dash board or fascia.
- d) In the case of any other badge or permit
 - i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge or permit is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen
 - ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge or permit is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle

resident means a person whose usual residence or second home is at a property listed in appendix A but does not include the landlord of a property if they do not reside at that property

road means any length of highway or of any other road to which the public has access including any length of footway, verge or grass verge comprising the road or bridges over which a road passes

restricted road means any of the roads, lengths of road, sides of road or parking places specified in the schedules

school entrance marking means an area of carriageway of a specified road which is contained within the road marking prescribed in diagram 1027.1 in schedule 6 of the 2002 Regulations and indicated by the sign prescribed in diagram 642.2A in schedule 2 of the 2002 Regulations

traffic sign means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised under or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the 1984 Act and in compliance with the 2002 Regulations

zone is an area identified in the relevant schedules relating to parking permits and is applicable to the properties in appendix A

GENERAL

- 2(a)** A person who contravenes any provision of this order, or who uses a vehicle, or permits a vehicle to be used in contravention of this order, shall be guilty of an offence and a penalty charge may be payable as a result of any contravention. Payment of the penalty charge shall be as set out on the penalty charge notice
- 2(b)** Parking contraventions and the level of penalty charge applicable to each contravention shall be set as specified by part 6 of The Traffic Management Act 2004
- 2(c)** The orders in appendix D are revoked
- 2(d)** This order comes into operation on 17th September 2010 and may be cited as "Devon County Council (Traffic Regulation & On-Street Parking Places) Order 2010"

PART B – PROHIBITION OF WAITING

no waiting at any time

- 3 Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a length of road contrary to the restrictions specified in the parts of schedule 1

no waiting for periods less than at any time

- 4 Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a length of road contrary to the restrictions specified in the parts of schedule 2

PART C - PROHIBITION OF LOADING AND UNLOADING

- 5 Save as provided in part J the loading and unloading of goods from a vehicle is not permitted to take place contrary to the restrictions specified in the parts of schedule 3

PART D – PROHIBITION OF STOPPING - CLEARWAYS

- 6 Save as provided in part J articles 97(1), 97(2), 99, 100(g) and 100(h) a vehicle is not permitted to stop or wait in a length of road contrary to the restrictions specified the parts of schedule 9

PART E - SUSPENSION OF PARKING PLACES

- 7(1) The Council subject to such conditions or exemptions as they consider necessary may by notice or order suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof

- a) if it is satisfied that the use of that parking place should be restricted or prohibited by reason that works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the road, or by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the highway; or
- b) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety; or
- c) for preventing obstruction of the streets on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed; or
- d) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one building to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository; or
- e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at the times of weddings or funerals

- 7(2) The police may suspend for no longer than seven days the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary

PART F - DESIGNATION & USE OF PARKING PLACES

- 8 Each area on a highway comprising, unless otherwise described, the length of carriageway of a street specified in schedules 4 to 8, 10, 11 and 13 bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway is designated as a parking place

miscellaneous conditions

- 9 A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place
- a) to unreasonably prevent access to any premises adjoining a road or use of a road by other persons or so as to be a nuisance; or
 - b) to unreasonably hinder access at a dropped kerb, cycle track, or crossing place and where the carriageway is raised to assist pedestrians or cyclists ;or

- c) when such parking place or part thereof has been closed in accordance with the provisions of article 7

10 No person shall

- a) sell, offer or exhibit for sale or hire any vehicle while it is in a parking place; or
- b) use a vehicle while it is in a parking place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of their skills in handicraft or services in any capacity

provided always that this article shall not be deemed to prohibit persons employed in connection with a licensed public service or a licensed hackney carriage operation from plying for hire or accepting passengers for hire in accordance with any regulation or condition under which the service is required by law to operate

11 No person shall carry out upon any vehicle while it is in a parking place any work of construction, cleaning, maintenance or repair except such as may be expedient to enable the vehicle to be moved from the parking place

moving and removing vehicles

12 When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of or non compliance with any of the provisions of this order a person authorised by and on behalf of the issuing authority may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place or if appropriate move the vehicle so that its position complies with those provisions

13 A person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of article 12 may do so in such manner as they think expedient

14 In case of emergency the police or a person authorised by the issuing authority may alter the position of a vehicle in the parking place or remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place to a place they think fit

15 When the police or a person authorised by the issuing authority removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place they shall make arrangements as are reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle

manner of standing in parking places

16 The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in, or to depart from, the parking place

17 A vehicle may only be parked wholly within a parking place defined either by use of lines on the carriageway or places inset in the footpath or verge identifiable by the use of surface materials or extended kerb limits, or wholly within a parking space

limited waiting parking places

18 Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a parking place contrary to the restrictions specified in the various parts to schedules 4 and 13

pay & display

19(1) ¹Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a parking place listed in the various parts to schedule 5 contrary to the restrictions specified and without having obtained the appropriate ticket and then displaying the ticket in a relevant position or without having made the appropriate payment by means of a mobile phone or device if payment is required

- 19(2)** ¹Motorhomes or goods vehicles exceeding the size limitations of a parking space must make additional appropriate ticket payments or obtain additional tickets where there is a period of parking available for which there is no charge for each additional space or part of a parking space into which any part of their vehicle encroaches, sufficient for the duration of the intended length of stay, subject to the maximum stay permitted at that parking place and then displaying the correct amount of tickets in a relevant position
- 20** ²Pay and display ticket machines will be placed at regular intervals along the parking place. In the event of a ticket machine being inoperable and an alternative ticket machine is available nearby the driver must obtain a ticket, and display the ticket in a relevant position. If no alternative ticket machine is available for use, and the driver is unable to make a payment by means of a mobile phone or device or to obtain a ticket where there is a period of parking available for which there is no charge, a note stating the time and date of parking must displayed in a relevant position in the vehicle. The vehicle must not be parked for any longer than the maximum period of parking permitted for that parking place and must not return to the parking place within 1 hour
- 21** ³The initial charge is payable on the leaving of a vehicle in a parking place referred to in schedule 5 and is the appropriate payment specified in corresponding tariff of appendix C to purchase a ticket from a pay and display ticket machine or a payment made by means of a mobile phone or device to cover the anticipated length of stay subject to the maximum stay permitted at that parking place
- 22** ⁴Upon payment of the initial charge for the vehicle or where there is a period of parking available for which there is no charge any valid ticket(s) must be displayed in a relevant position
- 23** ⁵Where an initial charge has been made or where there is a period of parking available for which there is no charge on the leaving of a vehicle in a parking place referred to in article 22 by obtaining a ticket from the relevant pay and display ticket machine or a payment made by means of a mobile phone or device that vehicle is not
- (i) to remain in the parking place after the end of the initial period; or
 - (ii) to have additional time purchased for it if the total amount of time it remains in the parking place exceeds the maximum stay permitted for that parking place; or
 - (iii) permitted to return to that parking place until 1 hour has elapsed since the end of the last period of waiting in that parking place unless the parking place is subject to a maximum period of waiting in 24 hours in which case the vehicle may not return within 24 hours of the last period of waiting in that parking place

resident permit parking places

- 24** Each length of road described in schedule 6 other than those lengths specified in schedules 1, 2, 7 and 9 are authorised as a parking place for parking permit holders as specified in the various parts to schedule 6 and under the conditions set by part G
- 25** Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a parking place in schedule 6 contrary to the restrictions specified in the various parts to that schedule

disabled badge holder only parking places

- 26** Each length of road described in schedule 7 is authorised as a parking place for disabled badge holders as specified in the various parts to that schedule

- 27 Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a parking place specified in schedule 7 unless it is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge

loading / unloading only bays

- 28 Each length of road described in schedule 8 is authorised as a parking place for vehicles or goods vehicles loading and unloading goods as specified in the various parts to that schedule
- 29 Save as provided in part J a vehicle or goods vehicle is not permitted to wait in the parking places specified in schedule 8 unless loading or unloading is taking place and if applicable unless it is the class of vehicle as specified in any particular part of that schedule

taxi bays

- 30 Each length of road described for use by taxis which is licensed under the Local Government Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1976 for use as a taxi rank or stand is authorised as a parking place for taxis
- 31 Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait on a licensed taxi rank or stand unless the vehicle is a taxi

motorcycle parking places

- 32 Each area of road described in schedule 10 is authorised as a parking place for motorcycles
- 33 Save as provided in part J a vehicle other than a motorcycle is not permitted to wait in the parking places specified in schedule 10
- 34 Every motorcycle left in a parking place shall stand within the limits of the parking place

parking places for buses, coaches, community buses & public service vehicles

- 35 Each area on a highway described in schedule 11 is authorised as a parking place for the type of vehicle and if applicable for the maximum amount of time only as specified in the various parts to schedule 11
- 36 Save as provided in part J no vehicle other than the type of vehicle authorised to wait in that parking place by the various parts to schedule 11 is permitted to wait in the parking places specified in that schedule and no authorised vehicle is permitted to wait for longer than the permitted period

ambulance & police parking places

- 37 Each area of road described in schedule 12 part 01 is authorised as a parking place for police vehicles
- 38 Each area of road described in schedule 12 part 02 is authorised as a parking place for ambulances
- 39 The driver of a vehicle shall not permit a vehicle to enter or wait in the parking places specified in article 37 unless it is a marked police car or in article 38 unless it is a marked ambulance and they must be parked wholly within the parking place
- 40 Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a parking place in schedule 12 contrary to the restrictions specified in articles 37 and 38

permit holder parking bays

- 41 Each area of road specified in the various parts of schedule 13 is authorised as a parking place for vehicles displaying a valid permit as described in the heading of that part of the schedule relating to the length of road

- 42 The driver of a vehicle is not permitted to enter the parking place specified in article 41 unless it is a vehicle with a valid permit relating to that parking place
- 43 The issuing authority may specify in the application form for a permit and/or it may be specified in a schedule part heading which properties are eligible for a permit
- 44 The issuing authority may specify in the application form for a permit and/or it may be specified in a schedule part heading the conditions of use for a permit and a charge may be payable for a permit if specified in appendix B
- 45 Save as provided in part J a vehicle is not permitted to wait in a parking place listed in the various parts of schedule 13 contrary to articles 41 to 44

PART G - PROVISIONS RELATING TO PARKING PERMITS

- 46(1) For the purposes of administering a permit parking zone the Council shall define such parking zones as necessary
- 46(2) Appendix A contains the list of zones and the type of permits eligible for use in the relevant zones
- 46(3) Appendix B contains the list of the permit types and related charges
- 46(4) Permits with the exception of visitor permits have to be renewed annually unless there are specific provisions in place to the contrary and information regarding this will be provided on the application form for the permit
- 47 The issuing authority may require a permit applicant to produce evidence in respect of the application as they reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given
- 48 The issuing authority can terminate all rights granted by the permit if at any time there is any contravention of any of the provisions contained in this order and the permit holder will not be entitled to any refund in respect of the amount paid for the permit
- 49 Appropriate remittance is the sum specified in appendix B for the period that relates to a permit which is valid in one or more of the designated parking places referred to in the schedules and may be varied by a minute of a relevant committee of the Council
- 50 All permits types remain the property of the issuing authority

vehicles for which permits can be used

- 51 Private cars, minibuses and motor homes not able to carry more than 12 passengers, and light goods vehicles (maximum laden weight 3500kgs) may use a permit issued under the provisions in this part of the order unless there are specific provisions in place to the contrary and information regarding this will be provided on the application form for the permit

eligibility for residents to apply for parking permits

- 52 A resident who is the owner/permanent user of a vehicle may apply to issuing authority for the issue of a parking permit for the applicable zone and the application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the appropriate remittance

lost damaged destroyed or replacement permits

- 53 If a permit is lost, damaged, destroyed or requires renewing due to a change of vehicle the permit holder may apply to the issuing authority for the issue of a replacement and the issuing authority upon being satisfied as to the loss, damage or destruction shall upon payment of a fee determined under appendix B issue a replacement permit and

upon such issue the permit which it replaces shall become invalid. If a permit requires replacement due to a change of vehicle the permit holder may apply to the issuing authority for the issue of a replacement and the issuing authority upon being satisfied as to the legitimacy of the change of vehicle shall upon receipt of a fee determined in appendix B issue a replacement. No refunds will be made regarding the original permit

- 54 If a permit becomes mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars become illegible or the colour becomes altered by fading or otherwise the permit holder shall surrender it to the issuing authority and may then apply for the issue of a replacement permit
- 55 If a permit is lost or destroyed and the permit holder has applied to the issuing authority for the issue of a replacement the original must be surrendered if it is subsequently found or retrieved
- 56 The provisions of this order apply to the replacement permit and application for the permit as if it were a permit or as the case may be an application for a permit

transfer and surrender of permits

- 57 A parking permit shall not be assigned or transferred to any person or business but may be surrendered at any time to the issuing authority and shall be surrendered in the event of
 - a) the permit holder ceases to be eligible for a permit by virtue of no longer being resident or located in the relevant zone; or
 - b) the permit holder ceases to be the owner of the vehicle to which a permit has been issued; or
 - c) a replacement permit issued under the provisions of articles 53 and 54; or
 - d) the expiry of the period for which the permit was issued
- 58 A permit holder may surrender a permit to the issuing authority at any time and shall surrender a permit on the occurrence of any of the events set out in article 57
- 59 The issuing authority may by notice in writing served on the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's residence withdraw a permit if it appears that any of the events set out in article 61 has occurred and the permit holder shall surrender the permit within forty-eight hours of the receipt of the said notice
- 60 It shall be an offence to alter the said parking permit in any manner and any person so doing may have the parking permit withdrawn
- 61 The issuing authority may at its discretion levy an administration charge for the issue of a replacement permit whether or not a charge was made for the permit it replaces
- 62 All permits must be clearly displayed in a relevant position and in such a way that **all** the details on the front of the permit can be read from outside the vehicle and not obscured in any way

PART H - ELIGIBILITY FOR PERMITS

residents permits

- 63 Residents of any property in appendix A may apply for an eligible parking permit for use in the related zone.
- 64 A maximum of 2 resident permits will be available from the issuing authority for residential addresses in the zones listed in appendix A unless otherwise identified by article 65

- 65** The following exceptions apply to article 64 to the zones marked * in appendix A
- a) Sandy Park Zone, Exeter residents shall be limited to 1 permit per property
 - b) The Quay and Torridge Road (Blackies), Appledore; Fortfield Terrace, Sidmouth; and Tiverton Parkway; Burlescombe & Sampford Peverell residents have no specified limit although the issuing authority reserve the right to limit the amount of permits issued and the permit must be used subject to the conditions on the application form for that permit
 - c) Salcombe pre-existing permit holders may continue to purchase up to two permits per property if two vehicles are registered to the address. New residents are eligible for 1 permit only per property
 - d) Salcombe second home owners are eligible for 1 permit only per property valid between 1st November to 31st March
- 66** Zones in appendix A marked # have an exemption for disabled person's vehicles as specified in article 108
- 67** Where the property owner acts as landlord for their property in a residents parking zone and are not eligible for residents or visitor permits at any other address within that residents parking zone, they may at the discretion of the Council apply for one book of visitors permits per year for use in the related zone and as specified in article 70(2)
- 68** On receipt of an application made under the provisions of this part of the order and of the appropriate remittance the issuing authority upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner/permanent user of a vehicle of the class specified in article 51 may issue to the applicant one parking permit for the leaving of the vehicle to which the parking permit relates by the owner of that vehicle or by any person using the vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person who the vehicle has been let for hire or reward, in any parking place to which the parking permit relates
- 69** A property's continued eligibility to qualify for permits where a property is redeveloped is at the discretion of the Council

visitor permits

- 70(1)** A resident may apply for the issue of visitor permits for a vehicle belonging to a visitor to that resident. The application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information required by that form. Each visitor permit will be valid for the day specified in article 74 and will expire 10am the following day and is only valid for use in the zone for which it is issued
- 70(2)** Subject to article 67 a landlord may apply for the issue of one book of 30 visitor permits per residents parking area or zone for use in a vehicle belonging to them or contractor undertaking duties at the property on behalf of the landlord. The application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information required by such form. Each visitor permit will be valid for the day specified in article 74 and will expire at 10am the following day and is only valid for use in the zone for which it is issued
- 71** Exeter Sandy Park Zone residents are limited to 1 book of 30 permits per year and for all other zones eligible for visitor permits residents are entitled to apply for a maximum of 2 books per year
- 72** The issuing authority may require an applicant for visitor permits to produce to the issuing authority such evidence in respect of the application as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them - this may include proof of residence which must be dated within the last three months and clearly state the name and address of the applicant
- 73** The issuing authority upon being satisfied that an applicant is a resident and eligible for visitor permits and in receipt of the appropriate remittance listed in appendix B may

issue to that applicant a book of visitor permits for the parking in a residents parking place adjacent to the lengths of road specified in those resident parking zones listed in appendix A of a vehicle of a class described in article 51 belonging to or on hire to a person visiting that resident

- 74** A visitor permit shall include the following particulars
- a) be marked identifying the permit for use by a visitor
 - b) the address of the resident to whom it was issued
 - c) the registration of the visitors vehicle
 - d) the day and date it is valid
 - e) the zone in which it is valid for use
 - f) an authentication that it was issued by the issuing authority
- 75** Prior to use of a visitor permit the applicant must complete the permit and ensure that it is displayed clearly in the vehicle
- 76** A vehicle displaying a valid visitor permit in respect of that vehicle so that all of the particulars are readily visible from the outside of the vehicle shall be permitted to be left in a parking place in an eligible zone as specified in appendix A

business permits

- 77** A business that requires a person employed by that business being the owner of a vehicle used solely for the purpose associated with the business and whose business address lies within a zone listed in appendix A may apply to the issuing authority for a permit subject to compliance with the current conditions of use of such permits. Applications shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information required by that form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the appropriate remittance
- 78** A registered charity may apply for a business permit under the same conditions as specified in this part of the order but at a reduced remittance as specified in appendix B
- 79** The appropriate remittance regarding a business permit is specified in appendix B and a maximum of 3 permits may be issued to each business or registered charity

On receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this part of the order and of the appropriate remittance the issuing authority upon being satisfied that the applicant is a business located within the relevant zone or is a person applying on behalf of and with the consent of such a business and the vehicle(s) meet the conditions described above and all other details relating to eligibility may issue to the applicant such permit(s) for use only by the business to which such permit(s) have been allocated and for use only within the relevant eligible zone

essential visitor permits

- 80** A resident of an eligible zone in appendix A who is disabled badge holder or a person in need of regular visits to provide care in the home and who can provide a declaration confirming that need from their doctor or from the appropriate department of the Council and whose property lies within an eligible zone listed in appendix A may apply to the issuing authority for the issue of an essential visitor permit and the application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information as required by such form
- 81** A maximum of one essential visitor permit may be issued to each eligible residence
- 82** The issuing authority on being satisfied that an applicant is eligible as specified in article 80 may issue to an applicant one essential visitor permit for the parking of a vehicle of a class described in article 51 belonging to or being used with the permission of the owner or on hire to a person visiting the resident
- 83** An essential visitor permit shall be in writing and shall include
- a) An authentication that the permit has been issued by the issuing authority

b) The zone in which the permit is valid for use

84 A vehicle displaying an essential visitor permit valid in respect of that vehicle so that all of the particulars referred to in article 83 are readily visible from the outside of the vehicle shall be permitted to be left in a parking place in the relevant eligible zone specified in appendix A

85 When a permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of article 83 no person shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle or by the person to who the permit was issued

visitor permits for hotels & guest houses

86 A guest house or hotel that is at premises the postal address of which is within the zones specified in appendix A may apply for the issue of guest house/hotel permits for vehicles of the class described in article 51 and belonging to a guest staying at that guest house or hotel. Any such application shall be made on a form issued by the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information required by the form

87 The issuing authority may at any time require an applicant for a permit to produce such evidence in respect of an application made to them for a permit as they may reasonably call to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any permit issued by them to verify that the permit is valid

88 Upon receipt of an application made under the provisions of this part of the order the issuing authority being satisfied that the applicant is a guest house owner or hotelier may issue to the applicant one or more batches of daily visitor permits for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place in the relevant eligible zone specified in appendix A a vehicle belonging to a visitor of the guest house or hotel. Guest house/hotel permits shall be issued in batches of 20 on receipt of the appropriate remittance prescribed in appendix B

89 A guest house/hotel visitor permit for shall include

- a) A mark identifying the permit as for use by guests of a guest house or hotel
- b) The name of the guest house or hotel it was issued to
- c) The registration of the guest's vehicle
- d) The day and date on which the vehicle has been initially parked
- e) The zone in which the permit is valid for use
- f) An authentication that the permit has been issued by the issuing authority
- g) A counterfoil to include details of the guest's vehicle

90 Prior to use of a permit the guest must read the instructions on use of the permit. The driver must complete the permit and counterfoil as specified in article 89

91 The driver must display the completed permit so that all the particulars required by article 89 are readily visible from the nearside of the vehicle

92 Any misuse of the guest house/hotel visitor permit will result in no further permits being issued to the offending hotel or guest house proprietor or their representative for one year from the date of misuse

93 Hotel/guest house daily visitor permit holders may wait without time limit in the

- a) limited waiting parking places specified in article 104
- b) pay and display parking spaces specified in article 105

doctors & vets parking permits

94 A doctors practice requiring an employee who is the owner of a vehicle used for a purpose associated with the practice and having insufficient available off street parking either within the premises or nearby and whose practice address lies within a part of schedule 13, may apply to the issuing authority for a parking permit subject to compliance with the current conditions of use of such permits. Such applications shall

be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information required by the form to be supplied and the remittance specified in appendix B will be payable

- 95** A vets practice that requires an employee who is the owner of a vehicle used for a purpose associated with the practice and having insufficient available off street parking either within the premises or nearby and whose veterinary practice address lies within a part of schedule 13, may apply to the issuing authority for a parking permit subject to compliance with the current conditions of use of such permits. Such applications shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the issuing authority and shall include the particulars and information required by the form to be supplied and the remittance specified in appendix B will be payable
- 96** On receipt of an application made under article 94 or 95 and of the appropriate remittance to the issuing authority and upon being satisfied that the applicant is a business as specified in article 94 or 95 or is a person applying on behalf of and with the consent of such a practice and the vehicle(s) meet the conditions described above and all other details relating to eligibility, the issuing authority may issue to the applicant such permit(s) for use only by the practice to which such permit(s) have been allocated and for use only within the nominated parking places within a part appropriate to schedule 13

PART J - EXEMPTIONS FROM PROHIBITIONS & RESTRICTIONS

- 97(1)** Nothing in this order shall apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform
- 97(2)** Nothing in this order shall apply to a vehicle being used for ambulance, coastguard, fire or police purposes in relation to an emergency or whilst in pursuit of duties **or** police purposes if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion

loading and unloading of goods

- 98(1)** Nothing in articles 3 and 4 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any restricted road which is designated or authorised and described in schedules 1 and 2 for so long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle
- 98(2)** Notwithstanding anything in paragraph 1
- a) the driver of a vehicle waiting for the purposes of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle shall move the vehicle on the instruction of a police constable in uniform or civil enforcement officer whenever such moving may be necessary for the purposes of preventing obstruction
 - b) the driver of a vehicle is not permitted to wait for the purposes of collecting goods or merchandise or loading or unloading the vehicle which is designated or authorised and described in the various parts to schedule 3

general exemption from prohibitions and restrictions

- 99** ¹Nothing in articles 3, 4, 6, 18, 19, 20, 24, 26, 28, 31 and 41 make it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a restricted road for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle
- a) if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in another road to be used in connection with or for;
 - (i) the removal of any obstruction to traffic
 - (ii) the maintenance, reconstruction or improvement to the length of road

- (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the lengths of road of a sewer, main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications apparatus as defined in schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984
- (iv) an emergency response for gas, water or sewerage leaks or mains electricity repairs **provided** that a notice on **business headed paper** stating contact details of where the driver can be located is displayed on the windscreen of the vehicle **and provided** that this exemption shall not apply to part C (article 5) & part D (article 6)
- (v) urgent industrial building or demolition operations **provided** that a notice on **business headed paper** stating contact details of where the driver can be located is displayed on the windscreen of the vehicle **and provided** that this exemption shall not apply to part C (article 5) & part D (article 6)
- b) if it cannot conveniently be used in another road to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
- c) planned building, property maintenance, landscaping or servicing works, or any other purpose authorised by and described on a dispensation notice issued in advance of the commencement of any such works or purposes and paid for where required, or displaying a temporary permit issued at the discretion of and by the issuing authority or its agents, and provided such dispensation notice or temporary permit is clearly visible through the windscreen of the vehicle on the dashboard

100 ¹Nothing in articles 3, 4, 5, 18, 19, 24, 26, 28, 31, 32 and 41 make it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait or park in a restricted road for so long as may be necessary to enable

- a) a person to get in to or out of the vehicle, or to load or unload personal luggage
- b) a hackney carriage to be on hire upon a duly authorised taxi rank in accordance with the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976
- c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 4(3) of the Postal Services Act 2000
- d) a refuse or waste collection vehicle to collect waste products from premises situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of road for so long as waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with its duties
- e) the principal vehicle to wait or park at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to any of the said lengths of road, for so long as waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with a wedding or funeral
- f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road
- g) a bus to wait on a marked bus bay
- h) the vehicle to wait or park if required by law to stop, or if the driver is being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond their control, or in order to avoid an accident
- i) a vehicle attending a medical emergency by a doctor, district nurse, midwife, or appointed social worker in which cases the Council may request written evidence of a genuine emergency

101 Nothing in articles 18 and 24 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a restricted road for so long as may be necessary to enable

- a) a vehicle being used by a qualified medical practitioner (as defined in section 55 of the Medical Act 1983) chiroprapist, occupational therapists or nurse practitioner providing medical or nursing care; or
- b) any vehicle which is being used for essential storage and transportation of equipment used by the aforementioned or social workers, care and voluntary workers delivering essential services to residents and they shall be allowed to park **only** whilst undertaking home visits at the patients place of residence

- 102** Nothing in articles 18, 19, 24 and 28 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any restricted road for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle
- a) to wait when being used in connection with posting or removing advertising material in the form of posters or cleaning windows or chimneys in premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting provided that a notice stating the location where the driver can be located is clearly displayed in windscreen of the vehicle
 - b) to be used in connection with the removal of furniture from one building to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository
- 103** Nothing in articles 19(1) and 24 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in any restricted road if the vehicle is a motorcycle

EXEMPTIONS FOR PERMIT HOLDERS

limited waiting

- 104** Permit holders may wait without time limit in the limited waiting parking places in the lengths of road specified in the applicable parts to schedule 4 **provided always** that any driver who is issued with a parking permit under the terms and conditions specified in this order may only park in the limited waiting places consistent with the zone to which their parking permit applies [for the avoidance of doubt an applicable part of the schedule refers to an item heading that states there is an exemption for permit holders]

pay and display

- 105** Permit holders may wait without time limit in the pay and display parking spaces in the lengths of road specified in the applicable parts to schedule 5 **provided always** that any driver who is issued with a parking permit under the terms and conditions specified in this order may park in the pay and display places consistent with the zone to which their parking permit applies [for the avoidance of doubt an applicable part of the schedule refers to an item heading that states there is an exemption for permit holders]

disabled persons vehicles

- 106** Nothing in articles 3 and 4 shall make the owner of a vehicle liable to a penalty charge by causing or permitting a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the roads, lengths of road or sides of road referred to in the various parts of schedules 1 and 2 for a maximum of 3 hours during the relevant operational period not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous waiting by the same vehicle in that length of road
- 107** Nothing in articles 18 and 19 shall make the owner or driver of a vehicle liable to a penalty charge by causing or permitting a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge to wait in the lengths of road referred to in those articles **provided** the exemption in relation to article 19(1) [pay and display] is applicable unless indicated by a traffic sign to the contrary and in the applicable parts to schedule 5 in which case a time limit may be applicable [for the avoidance of doubt an applicable part of the schedule refers to an item heading that states there is a time limit for disabled person's vehicles]
- 108** For the avoidance of doubt a disabled persons vehicle is not permitted to
- a) wait or stop in any length of road referred to in articles 5 and 6
 - b) wait in any length of road referred to in articles 28, 30, 32, 35, 37 and 38

- c) wait in any length of road referred to in article 24 unless specified in article 66 and in a zone marked # in appendix A
- d) wait in any length of road referred to in article 41
