## your day out costs so little



## buy your ticket...

from the driver on any Dartmoor Sunday Rover bus, at Plymouth rail station, or from the conductor on the Tamar Valley or Dartmoor Line trains.

## when you can use your ticket...

**every Sunday from 29th May – 18th September 2005**

Bank Holiday Monday 29th August – there is no Dartmoor line train on Bank Holidays and the ticket is not valid on Tamar Valley line trains.

## and there's more

The days out shown in this leaflet are just a few of the many trips that can be enjoyed using your Dartmoor Sunday Rover ticket. If you would like to plan your own day out, pick up a copy of the Sunday Rover guide – it contains complete timetables and further suggested days out.

# Sunday Rover

# The Grand Tour

Transmoor Link, City of Exeter,  
Tamar Valley Line





First we enjoy the wonderful views from the top deck of the famous Transmoor Link bus travelling across the very heart of Dartmoor to Exeter where time is allowed to explore the city. Then by Dartmoor Line train through Crediton to Okehampton where the railway station has recently been restored in 1950's style. You can stop for refreshments and visit the gift and model shop. Next by bus along the northern edge of Dartmoor and through Tavistock to Gunnislake where we join the train for a scenic ride along the Tamar Valley line crossing Calstock Viaduct and back home to Plymouth.

# Classic Circular

Totnes, Widecombe-in-the-Moor,  
Tamar Valley Line

Travel via Ivybridge and along the southern slopes of Dartmoor to Totnes. Time here for a riverside stroll and refreshments before travelling by bus along the Dart Valley to Widecombe-in-the-Moor to explore the village gift shops and cafes. Enjoy a pub lunch or traditional Devon Cream Tea before joining the bus for a scenic ride across Dartmoor to Gunnislake Station passing Dartmeet, Two Bridges, Princetown and Tavistock. Return to Plymouth by train along the scenic Tamar Valley line crossing Calstock Viaduct and beside the River Tamar.

# Moorland Explorer

Tamar Valley Line, Widecombe,  
Castle Drogo, Transmoor Link

Travel by train along the scenic Tamar Valley line crossing Calstock Viaduct to Gunnislake. Then by bus through Tavistock and across the heart of Dartmoor to famous Widecombe-in-the-Moor passing Princetown, Two Bridges and Dartmeet. Time to explore the village gift shops and enjoy a pub lunch before joining the bus for the ride passing Haytor Rocks to Castle Drogo where you can explore the house and gardens\*. Return to Plymouth via Moretonhampstead and then enjoy a grandstand view of Dartmoor from the top deck of the Transmoor Link.

*\*You can obtain discounted admission to Castle Drogo on production of your Dartmoor Sunday Rover ticket. Admission to grounds free.*
