DEFINITIVE MAP MODIFICATION ORDER 2006

This Order is made by Devon County Council under section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the Act") because it appears to that authority that the County of Devon Definitive Map and Statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(c)(i), namely, the discovery by the authority of evidence which (when considered with all other relevant evidence available to them) shows that a right of way which is not shown in the map and statement subsists or is reasonably alleged to subsist over land in the area to which the map relates, being a right of way to which Part III of the Act applies.

The Authority has consulted with every local authority whose area includes the land to which the Order relates. The Devon County Council hereby order that:

1. For the purposes of this Order the relevant date is 13th September 2005
2. The County of Devon Definitive Map and Statement shall be modified as described in Part I and Part II of the Schedule and shown on the map attached to the Order.
3. This Order shall take effect on the date it is confirmed and may be cited as the Devon County Council (Bridleway Nos. 16 & 17, Bishop's Tawton and Footpath Nos. 18 & 19, Bishop's Tawton) Definitive Map Modification Order 2006.

SCHEDULE

PART I

MODIFICATION OF DEFINITIVE MAP

DESCRIPTION OF PATH OR WAY TO BE ADDED

Bridleway No. 16, Bishop's Tawton, in the administrative district of North Devon.

This is a Bridleway. It starts from the minor county road near Codden Hill Cross at point A on plan no. ED/PROW/06/14 (GR SS 5682 2968) and proceeds generally east northeastwards along a track for approximately 690 metres through gates at points B and C to end at the minor county road, Sentry Lane, point D (GR SS 5745 2986). The path has a width of approximately 3 metres defined by the boundaries of the track.

It is shown as a broken line with crossbars in the intervals.

Bridleway No. 17, Bishop's Tawton, in the administrative district of North Devon.

This is a Bridleway. It starts from the minor county road near Codden Hill Cross at point A on plan no. ED/PROW/06/14 (GR SS 5682 2968) and proceeds generally southeastwards along a field access track turning northwards and then generally eastwards through a hunting gate onto and across Codden Hill for approximately 1350 metres to point E. It then turns northwards and eastwards to point J and then generally southwards to point G for approximately 670 metres then turning eastwards to follow a track for approximately 340 metres through a hunting gate and a field gate to end at the unsurfaced minor county road, Clement's Lane, point H (GR SS 5886 2944), for a total of approximately 2360 metres. The path has a width of approximately 3 metres defined by the boundaries of the tracks.

It is shown as a broken line with crossbars in the intervals.

Footpath No. 18, Bishop's Tawton, in the administrative district of North Devon.

This is a Footpath. It starts from near a gate on a track, Bridleway No. 16, at point C on plan no. ED/PROW/06/14 (GR SS 5743 2983) and proceeds southwards and then generally eastwards along a track below Codden Hill to point I. It then turns generally southeastwards and southwestwards onto a track on Codden Hill to end on Bridleway No. 17 north east of the summit at point J (GR SS 5849 2968), for a total of approximately 1500 metres. The path has a minimum width of 2 metres and a maximum width of approximately 5 metres where defined by the boundaries of the tracks.

It is shown as a broken line with short intervals.

Footpath No. 19 Bishop's Tawton, in the administrative district of North Devon.

This is a Footpath. It starts from point E on plan no. ED/PROW/06/14 (GR SS 5811 2961) and proceeds generally eastwards for approximately 460 metres onto a track and through a hunting gate at point F to end at point G on Bridleway No. 17 (GR SS 5851 2949). The path has a minimum width of 2 metres and a maximum width of approximately 3 metres where defined by the boundaries of the track.

It is shown as a broken line with short intervals.

MODIFICATION OF DEFINITIVE STATEMENT

VARIATION OF PARTICULARS OF PATH OR WAY

Bridleway No. 16, Bishop's Tawton

From: Near Codden Hill Cross

To: Sentry Lane

This is a Bridleway. It starts from the minor county road near Codden Hill Cross and proceeds generally east northeastwards along a track and passing through two gates to end at the minor county road, Sentry Lane. The length of the Bridleway is approximately 690 metres, with a width of approximately 3 metres. It has a mainly earth and stone surface.

Bridleway No. 17, Bishop's Tawton

From: Near Codden Hill Cross

To: Clement's Lane

This is a Bridleway. It starts from the minor county road near Codden Hill Cross and proceeds generally southeastwards along a field access track, turning northwards and then generally eastwards through a hunting gate onto and across Codden Hill to near the summit. It then turns northwards then eastwards north of the summit and generally southwards, then turning eastwards to follow a track east of the summit through a hunting gate and a field gate onto the unsurfaced minor county road, Clement's Lane. The length of the Bridleway is approximately 2360 metres, with a width of approximately 3 metres. It has a mainly earth and stone surface.

Footpath No. 18, Bishop's Tawton

From: Bridleway No. 16 near Sentry Lane

To: Near Codden Hill summit

The path is a Footpath. It starts from Bridleway No. 16 on a track below Codden Hill near Sentry Lane and proceeds southwards and then generally eastwards below Codden Hill, then turning generally southeastwards and southwestwards onto Codden Hill to end at Bridleway No. 17 north east of the summit. The length of the Footpath is approximately 1500 metres, with a width of between 2 metres and approximately 5 metres on the track. It has a mainly earth and stone surface.

Footpath No. 19, Bishop's Tawton

From: West of Codden Hill summit

To: East of Codden Hill summit

The path is a Footpath. It starts from Bridleway No. 17 west of the summit of Codden Hill and proceeds generally eastwards crossing the summit to the north of the monument on Codden Hill Beacon and onto a track to end at Bridleway No. 17 east of the summit. The length of the Footpath is approximately 460 metres, with a width of between 2 metres and approximately 3 metres on the track. It has a mainly earth and stone surface.
