



**DEFINITIVE MAP REVIEW 2008
PARISH OF HEANTON PUNCHARDON
CONSULTATION SCHEDULE**

Route 1: Application for addition of footpath

Continuation of Footpath No. 1, Braunton southwards along the flood bank in Heanton Punchardon parish, turning east to end at the Bue Wier slipway
Grid ref: SS 4832 3490 – 4893 3401

Route 2: Claimed addition of footpath

Unrecorded route from the minor road at Heanton Hill along Mill Lane northwards and turning northeastwards to join Footpath No. 3 near Heanton Mill
Grid ref: SS 4953 3568 – 4969 3592

Route 3: Variations in route of Footpath No. 6

Alternative routes in use to avoid obstructed definitive line, for possible diversions –
(a) continuation of track from Eastacombe Lane around paddock and (b) headland around edge of arable field and through woods to footbridge across the Knowl Water, continuing as Footpath No. 35, Braunton
Grid ref: SS 5031 3568 – 5036 3574 and 5054 3582 – 5063 3608

Route 4: Unrecorded route – Church path

From Eastacombe Lane near the start of Footpath No. 6, southwards and turning southwestwards along a path to the churchyard
Grid ref: SS 5028 3563 – 5025 3556

For information:

The Definitive Map and Statement is a legal record of public rights of way. There are four categories:

- Footpath - a highway over which the public have right of way on foot only
- Bridleway - a highway over which the public have a right of way on foot, on horseback or leading a horse, or on a bicycle
- Restricted byway - a highway over which the public have a right of way on foot, on horseback or leading a horse, on a bicycle, or in a horse-drawn carriage, but not for motorised vehicles
- Byway open to all traffic - a highway over which the public have a right of way for vehicular and all other kinds of traffic, but which is used by the public mainly as a footpath and bridleway.
