



DEFINITIVE MAP REVIEW OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY PARISH OF HEANTON PUNCHARDON

The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 requires the County Council to keep the Definitive Map of public rights of way under continuous review and to make modifications where it appears that routes should be added, regraded, amended or deleted. A review is currently being undertaken in the Parish of Heanton Punchardon.

Route 3: Variations in route of Footpath No. 6, E – F, G – H

Alternative routes in use to avoid obstructed definitive line, for possible diversions – (a) continuation of track from Eastacombe Lane around paddock and (b) headland around edge of arable field and through woods to footbridge across the Knowl Water, continuing as Footpath No. 35, Braunton
