

# DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP REVIEW PARISH OF WESTLEIGH

## SCHEDULE OF PROPOSALS

The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 requires the County Council to keep the Definitive Map of public rights of way under continuous review and to make modifications where it appears that routes should be added, regraded or deleted. A review is currently being undertaken in the Parish of Westleigh. There is currently one proposal as follows:

### **Proposal 1:** Unrecorded route to footpath

From the county road south west of Treyhill in a northerly then easterly then northerly direction past Treyhill for about 230 metres to join Footpath No. 4.

Grid ref: SS 4876 2874 - 4880 2894

The Definitive Map is a legal record of public rights of way. There are three categories:

- Footpath - means a highway over which the public have right of way on foot only
- Bridleway - means a highway over which the public have a right of way on foot, on horseback or leading a horse, or on a bicycle
- Byway open to all traffic - means a highway over which the public have a right of way for vehicular and all other kinds of traffic, but which is used by the public mainly as a footpath and bridleway
