

HOISTS Excess & Specials

- Blue Oxford Mini hoists
9 St Edmunds Court
2 Factory
These are used, but not often. O.Ts to be reminded that they exist and are smallest and easiest to use if the height of lift and weight are appropriate.
- 1 Oxford Mini hoists Advise as above.
1 St Edmunds Court
11 Factory
Should be put into catalogue alongside other stand aid and used up if possible.
- 4 Molift – useful as they fold down and can be stored away. Good for paediatrics as they go to the floor to pick up small children. – Slow turnover.
- 2 Oxford Majors (175 &190) St Edmunds Court
Very big to use in domestic setting, only useful if extra lift height required.
- 3 Harvest extreme – weight limit 225 Kg Bariatric hoist
1 St Edmunds court
2 Factory
- 4 Invacare Altos – very large, take 200Kg – sell to nursing homes or residential homes
- 2 Huntleigh TX150 – Midi sized with 4 point spreader bars, useful for those who are rounder and so find bending in the middle uncomfortable.
- Arjo – Sarita and Sara – standing hoists – sell to nursing or residential home or hospital
- 2 Arjo – Trixies – Expensive to service – sell to residential or nursing home or give to health
- Arjo Maxi lift and Encore – to Heavitree hospital for training purposes. Not enough storage for them. Suggest we keep Encore, possibly to ILC for assessment purposes. Maxi Lift – contact community hospitals, residential or nursing homes to see if they want it.
- Horsia Lexa – similar to Arjo Maxi Lift – sell to nursing or residential home. Too large for domestic setting
- Horsia Tonya (1) – one in service in the community so should keep in case replacement needed. They have patient positioning boom like Arjo.
- 2 Molift Standaids
- Invacare Reliant 600
