



Disability Living Allowance

Disability Living Allowance is a benefit for adults under the age of 65 and children with a severe disability who need help:

- getting around
- with personal care
- or both of these.

How much is the allowance?

Disability Living Allowance has two components and is paid at the following weekly rates for 2011/12:

Care Component - for help with personal care needs is paid at three levels.

Lowest Rate:	£19.55
Middle Rate:	£49.30
Highest Rate:	£73.60

Mobility Component - for help with getting around is paid at two levels.

Lowest Rate:	£19.55
Highest Rate:	£51.40

Disability Living Allowance is a **tax free** allowance which is **not means tested** and in **most cases** is paid on top of any other Social Security benefits.

Many people think they **cannot** claim Disability Living Allowance because they:

- have someone looking after them
- don't have someone looking after them
- live alone
- can feed, wash & dress themselves
- can use the toilet
- can walk
- are not registered as disabled
- are not receiving income support
- work.

None of the above stops anyone from claiming Disability Living Allowance.
