

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Unpublished Orders

- We hope that the exhibition has explained the proposals to you and that you find them acceptable. If you wish to make comments about the proposed Orders, you should write to:

Publication of Orders

- The made Side Roads Order and Compulsory Purchase Order will be published shortly. At that time, if you wish to make comment on the Orders, you will be able to write to the Local Authority Orders team, either in support or in objection to the Orders. Full details of the objection periods and the address for correspondence will be given when the Orders are made and the notices are published.

Public Inquiry

- After the objection period closes the Secretary of State for Transport will consider the objections received. The Secretary of State will then decide whether or not to hold a Public Inquiry into the proposals. An Inquiry would be held before an independent Inspector.

The Decision

- The Secretary of State will decide whether to confirm the Orders for the new road after consideration of the objections received and, if a Public Inquiry has been held, the Inspector's report.

Land Acquisition

- If the Orders are confirmed the Councils would then commence the process to acquire the land necessary for the scheme.

Construction

- Subject to the satisfactory completion of the statutory procedures and the availability of funds, the Councils would complete the land acquisition process. Construction of the road could start in 2010 and would take about 3 years to complete. It is envisaged that advance works would start 6 months before the main construction contract.
