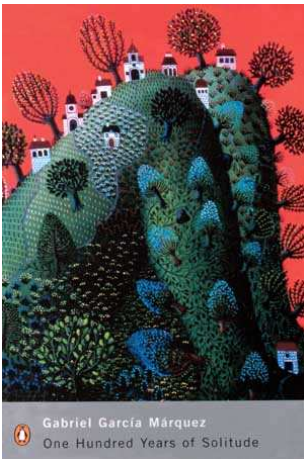


## **One Hundred Years of Solitude by Gabriel Marquez Garcia**
