CONSULTATION SCHEDULE**

Route 1: unrecorded route to bridleway A – B

From the county road near Tawstock Court and St Peter's Church, point A, in a south southeasterly direction along a track through woods, known as 'Golden Valley', for about 1415 metres to end at the county road, near Woodparks Lodge, point B.

Grid ref: SS 5591 2982 – 5649 2874

The following footpaths are recorded as cul-de-sac routes:

Route 2: Footpath No. 8, Tawstock

From the county road, B3232, at Upcott Farm, point C, to Hollamoor Clump, point D

Grid ref: SS 5591 2982 – 5649 2874

Route 3: Footpath No. 1, Yarnscombe (Torridge District)

From the county road near Shortridge, point E, to the Tawstock parish boundary, point F, with no continuation recorded in Tawstock

Grid ref: SS 5450 2503 – 5463 2526

For information:

The Definitive Map is a legal record of public rights of way. There are three categories:

- Footpath - means a highway over which the public have right of way on foot only
- Bridleway - means a highway over which the public have a right of way on foot, on horseback or leading a horse, or on a bicycle
- Byway open to all traffic - means a highway over which the public have a right of way for vehicular and all other kinds of traffic, but which is used by the public mainly as a footpath and bridleway
